



#### Did you Know?

90% of brain development happens by age 5. SPARK is a Fox Valley United Way's early childhood initiative designed to ensure that every child has the foundational skills they need to succeed in school and beyond.

Research has consistently shown that children who enter kindergarten without essential school readiness skills are more likely to face academic challenges throughout their education and are at a significantly higher risk of not



proficiency. In Aurora alone, nearly 50% of children under age 5 face one or more of these barriers.

SPARK is dedicated to changing the trajectory for these children. By providing early learning opportunities and empowering families, we're helping to close the achievement gap and build a stronger, more



If results suggest further evaluation is needed, referrals—with family consent—are made to Child & Family Connections (children under 3), the local school district (ages 3–5), or another appropriate agency.



We remain committed to supporting 211 and raising awareness so that our community members know where to turn before a struggle becomes a crisis.






