KINDERGARTEN READINESS

Over the past three years, SPARK has made significant strides in improving kindergarten readiness for young children in our community. Early childhood is a critical period of development, and preparing children for kindergarten has a lasting impact on their academic success. Through SPARK's comprehensive support services—ranging from early childhood agency referrals, to engaging playgroups and parent cafés—families receive the guidance and tools they need to nurture their child's early development. Initiatives like Abriendo Puertas and Lantern have empowered parents to be their child's first teacher, fostering strong early literacy, social-emotional skills, and cognitive growth. As a result, children entering kindergarten are better equipped to thrive, laying a strong foundation for continued learning and success in their educational journey.






When children enter school ready to learn equipped with strong early literacy, socialemotional, and cognitive skills—they are more likely to thrive in the classroom, reducing the need for remediation and increasing their chances of academic achievement. For Aurora, this means a future generation of students better prepared to succeed in school, graduate, and contribute positively to the local economy. Additionally, kindergarten readiness helps reduce educational disparities by ensuring that children from diverse backgrounds have access to the tools and support they need for a strong start, fostering a more equitable and vibrant community. Through programs like SPARK, the city of Aurora is investing in its youngest residents, creating a ripple effect that strengthens families and improves long-term outcomes for the entire community.

Promoting Equity

SPARK aims to close the education gap and promote equity by giving all children, regardless of their background, the skills they need to succeed from day one of school. Many children from low-income or underserved communities start school at a disadvantage due to limited access to early learning resources. SPARK levels the playing field, reducing the achievement gap. Early interventions in literacy, numeracy, and social-emotional skills set children up for long-term academic success, creating a more equitable and inclusive education system for all.





IMPACT ANALYSIS



At a Glance

This report demonstrates how direct services with intention and in collaboration with other local agencies can impact kindergarten readiness, creating equity in the Aurora community.

SPARK uses a combination of both Aurora, II data logged specifically by full-time staff members alongside published and current research.

Early Detection

SPARK reported a significant increase in screenings. Notably, a higher number of developmental and social-emotional screenings were provided to families in the Aurora community, (131 more in FY 24 than when launching the initiative the year prior). Increased screenings lead to greater chances of early detection of delays and access to therapy and intervention. On average, the cost of special education services can range from \$10,000 to \$20,000 per child annually, while early intervention services typically cost less and are more effective at mitigating long-term challenges. If even a small percentage screened receive early intervention that prevents the need for special education, the potential savings could range from \$207,000 to over \$414,000 annually. Additionally, children who receive appropriate early support are more likely to stay on track academically, reducing dropout rates and future social costs associated with unemployment and poverty.

Mental Health

SPARK supported positive mental health and wellness by providing 140 free playgroups in Aurora – creating a safe and supportive environment for children and parents to practice social skills, and build confidence significantly improving readiness for kindergarten. Children learn to navigate routines similar to those in kindergarten, such as transitioning between activities and following a teacher's guidance. This helps them adapt more smoothly to the expectations of a classroom setting, reducing the likelihood of behavior-related disruptions that could hinder learning. Additionally, engaging parents in these playgroups reinforces learning at home and empowers parents to be active participants in their child's education, further strengthening the child's developmental progress.

Academic Success

Increasing kindergarten readiness can lower the costs of educational interventions, which can average \$10,000 to \$20,000 per student per year for special education services. Additionally, preventing high school dropouts through early preparation can result in savings of around \$292,000 per individual over their lifetime, considering lower unemployment rates, decreased reliance on social programs, and reduced incarceration rates. For a city like Aurora, improving kindergarten readiness can save taxpayers millions over time while promoting economic growth and reducing social inequality.

Community Connection

SPARK became active members of the Integrated Referral and Intake System (IRIS). Utilizing IRIS has streamlined our referral process, ensuring families have constant contact which maintains a higher quality of service and level of communication between families and Early Childhood agencies. Referring families through IRIS for early childhood resources has a significant impact on improving kindergarten readiness and family well-being.

Through intentional partnerships, shared best practices, and a deep commitment to community trust, SPARK strengthens the early childhood landscape in Aurora—ultimately building a brighter, more equitable future for the city's youngest learners.

Our mission is to ignite the spark of learning in every child, and our vision is a thriving Aurora where all families have access to quality early education.

Over the past three years, SPARK has significantly improved kindergarten readiness in the community, recognizing early childhood as a crucial developmental period. Our support services—including referrals, resource connections, engaging playgroups, and parent workshops—empower families to nurture early development. Initiatives like Abriendo Puertas and Lantern have strengthened parental involvement, enhancing early literacy, social-emotional skills, and cognitive growth.

The impact of kindergarten readiness extends beyond individual children; it strengthens the entire Aurora community by paving the way for academic success and lifelong learning. Prepared children are more likely to thrive in school, reducing the need for remediation and contributing to a stronger local economy. By ensuring equitable access to early learning resources, SPARK helps close the achievement gap and promotes a more inclusive education system.

Our achievements include distributing over 5,600 bilingual books, hosting 140 free playgroups, conducting over 100 parent workshops, and completing 217 developmental screenings—leading to early detection of delays and timely interventions. This proactive approach benefits children and results in significant taxpayer savings—potentially between \$207,000 and \$414,000 annually—by reducing future special education costs and boosting academic outcomes.

SPARK also supports mental health and wellness by creating safe, engaging environments through playgroups that help children develop essential social skills and classroom readiness. Participation in the Integrated Referral and Intake System (IRIS) has significantly increased streamlined referrals, helping families access critical early intervention, healthcare, and educational services more efficiently.

With a diverse demographic—69.7% Hispanic/Latinx and broad representation from other racial backgrounds—SPARK remains committed to equity and long-lasting community impact. Our work shows that collaboration with local agencies and direct family services can meaningfully improve kindergarten readiness and help build a brighter future for Aurora.
